The Blossom Trail

The Blossom Trail Project was commenced in 2017. It began with a group of environmentally-concerned citizens envisioning a Blossom Trail flanking the sides of a pathway in a public park. This has now become Beaverton Park's Blossom Trail.

It began with an initial planting of 52 trees and 20 shrubs. In the fall of 2019, 1500 spring bulbs were planted. During the summer of 2020, 350 native perennial plants were incorporated into the project to initiate the naturalization of this space. This year 2021 more native specimen trees, shrubs, perennials and bulbs will be planted to continue the evolution of this award-winning endeavor.

The trail has become, as hoped, a beautiful planting to tease one's senses. More importantly this trail has become a corridor for wildlife, nesting birds, and a habitat for pollinators and small animals.

This project is spear headed by Sarah Cowley who delights with how the public has embrace this space to enjoy, to photograph and observe the ever-changing transformation of the landscape.

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
